Agenda 2 : Activity-wise review of the approved activities as on 30.6.2005.

E.C. reviewed the activity-wise progress as on 30.6.2005 and the following suggestions were given.

- Month-wise physical and financial targets should be set block-wise, district-wise and for state.
- Percentage of achievement under each activities against target should be prepared and placed before E.C, on the lines of MMR format.
- Monthly achievement under each activity as per calendar of activities mentioned in the district AWP & B should be high lighted.
- Graph depicting the district wise achievement should be prepared.
- Chinnara Angala-2005 to be documented and concurrent evaluation to be under taken for Chinnara Angala-2006.
- Information regarding release of funds to Model Cluster Schools under NPEGEL for civil works should be shared with Mahila Samakya in respect of the Clusters in which implementation is taken up by them.
- It is likely that allocation made for salary of Resource Teachers for IED may not be fully spent. Therefore additional activities need to be taken up to utilize available grants under IED. SPD was authorized to constitute a small group in consultation with Mrs. Ruma Banerjee of Seva-In-Action and take up additional activities.

Agenda 3 : Approval of Annual Report for the year 2002-03.

E.C. accorded approved for the Annual Report of SSA for the year 2002-03 and suggested to under take the following activities during the current year :

- Funds to be released from SSA for organising various subject-wise clubs for students at school level like Science club, Arts club, Humanities club etc. and Teacher's subject clubs at B.R.C. level to encourage peer learning process and interaction.
- Award to be instituted at Block level for the best feed back / drawing talent exhibited from students who have participated in "Chinnara Karnataka Darshana" Programme. For this purpose Expert Committee which is analysing the feed back forms should be entrusted with the responsibility of selecting the best entries at Block level.
- Concurrent, monitoring & evaluation of BRPs and CRPs to be undertaken.

Agenda 4 : Provision for supplying of Health Cards to school children

E.C. discussed the proposal regarding supply of Health Cards to school children. E.C. decided that, instead of providing Health Cards, School-wise Registers can be supplied. The Chairman advised the Commissioner for Public Instruction to consult the Commissioner for Health Services and to draft a programme for conducting General Health Checkup of all school going children. The services of private Doctors could also be utilised wherever necessary. Shortage of funds at school level regarding fuel charges, purchase of consumables, remuneration to Pvt. Doctors etc. can be met from out of District Management Cost of SSA. Rs.1.00 per child per annum can be earmarked.

Agenda 5 : Creation of posts for E-Governance unit and payment of salary of E-Governance staff from out of SSA Management cost.

The proposal placed before E.C. and was discussed at length. It is not a creation of posts but hiring of hands. It was agreed that there is necessity for establishment of E-governance unit of SSA to meet EMIS needs from schools, clusters and Block level. The Chairman opined to provide for 50% of the posts of E-Governance from SSA. The Govt. of India representative Mr. Ravi Ramachandra, Deputy Secretary, agreed to represent this matter to Secretary, MHRD and will intimate the decision of Govt. of India in this regard.

Agenda 6 : Providing resource material including books to BRC/CRCs as per recommendations of Books Selection Committee.

E.C. approved the recommendation of the Books Selection Committee for the supply of the following Resource Books to BRCs and CRCs and authorised SPD, SSA to take appropriate action in this regard.

1. **Geography resource books volume 1, 2 and 3** published from DSERT :
To get copy right from DSERT and make arrangements for printing & distribution of the resource books to the 176 BRC's and 2269 CRC's in the State.
2. **Jnana-Vignana Kosha** published by Ms. Nava Karnataka publications, Bangalore.
To place orders for supply of this resource book and distribution to 70 BRC's and 894 CRC's in the 11 SSA districts.

3. **English reading cards** published by R.I.E. Bangalore, costing Rs. 150 each, to be distributed to all the 176 BRC's and 2269 CRC's in the State.
4. In addition to the above Resource Books, E.C. authorised SPD, SSA to supply History Resource book published by DSERT and "Kiriya Vishwakosha" published by Hampi Kannada University to all the BRCs and CRCs in the State.

Agenda 7 : Establishment of Science Laboratory in Government Higher Primary Schools having 8th Std. in Government Higher Primary Schools having 8th Std.

E.C. authorised the SPD, SSA to examine whether the list already prepared at DSERT two years back can be adopted and whether the selected firms are in a position to supply the materials at the already approved rate.

If this is not feasible, E.C. authorised SPD, SSA to take appropriate action for constitution of Expert Committee for selection of science materials while conducting exhibition cum selection of materials by the Expert Committee at the State level.

The list of approved items along with the rate & the names of the firms can be sent from the State office to all the concerned schools, so that the concerned schools can place order directly with the selected firms latest by 30.9.2005.

Agenda 8 : Extra allocation for fuel (diesel) for certain BEOs, depending upon the geographic location and distance from district head quarters.

The EC directed to prepare a comprehensive proposal for making extra allocation for fuel to the BEOs depending upon the distance from district head quarters and the geographical area to be covered in each block. This proposal may be placed in the next E.C.

Agenda 9 : Any other subject with the permission of Chair

A. Tender for type design and construction of special toilets in schools for CWSN.

The EC felt that, a replicable model needs to be developed. Appropriate action may be taken in this regard.

B. Placing the minutes of the Project Approval Board of MHRD held on 15.4.2005 and the approved AWP & B for the year 2005-06

E.C. authorised SPD, SSA to initiate appropriate action for the implementation of all the approved activities as mentioned in the AWP & B for the year 2005-06.

C. Re-appropriation towards salary from out of District Management Cost in the six districts during 2005-06:

E.C. approved this proposal for re-appropriation of funds from other approved sub-activities under District Management Cost towards meeting salary expenses and misc. components in the six districts of Mandya, Hassan, Dakshina Kannada, Kodagu, Mysore and Chamarajanagar. Further E.C. authorised SPD, SSA to submit supplementary proposal to MHRD seeking additional funds, if the funds already allocated under District Management Cost is not sufficient.

D. Production of Documentary Tele-films on SSA :

E.C. authorized the SPD, SSA to take appropriate action for the production of one documentary Tele-film on SSA in general at a cost not exceeding Rs.3.00lakhs by following relevant procurement procedures from firms who have produced films for EDC, MS and Government Departments.

Further, the remaining Tele-films on various SSA activities should be produced at the rate of Rs.75000/- each as done by the DSERT by following the same procedure as adopted in producing films for EDUSAT by DSERT.

E. Payment of TA/DA as per KCSR to BEOs, CRCs and ECs.

E.C. authorised the SPD, SSA to work out a suitable revised proposal for the enhanced payment of Fixed Travelling Allowance to CRPs and ECs from out of District Management Cost of SSA. The revised proposal should be placed before next E.C.

F. Enhancement of Contingent expenditure grant for BRCs and CRCs.

E.C. discussed the proposal and agreed that, there is justification for enhancement of C.G. of Rs.12,500 per annum & RS.2,500 per annum payable to BRCs and CRCs respectively under SSA.

E.C. decided to allocate extra amount towards C.G. @ Rs.2.00 per teacher per month to BRCs and CRCs in addition to the already allocated amount and this extra cost can be met from out of District Management Cost.

Govt. of India representative present in the meeting Sri. Ravi Ramachandran, Deputy Secretary, MHRD expressed that the Central Govt. recognizes the good work done by SSA, Karnataka. He conveyed the feelings of Secretary, Elementary Education & Literacy, MHRD that SSA programmes is in safe hands in the State of Karnataka. Innovative programmes taken up by Karnataka such as using ICR technology for children survey and Chinnara Karnataka Darshana are commendable. However he raised the issues pointed out in the minutes of the PAB meeting dated 15.4.2005 . The State Project Director and the Chairman, E.C., explained the action taken at the State level.

The Chairman thanked all the members for having participated in the meeting and offering valuable suggestions.
